5:00 Immediately following Mass we will go outside for the dedication of the Sr. Margaret Sue Walking Trail.

Slightly after 7:00 (dark) – There will be a professional Fireworks Display.

After the fireworks, Rockin Robin and area bands will lead a 21-year-old and over music feast.



Grandparents' Day Prayer Service

9:00 a.m. Sacred Heart School Gym

We will celebrate our grandparents on Monday, September 12 at 9:00 a.m. during a prayer service in the school gym. Some of our returning parents may remember we usually hold this day in January during Catholic Schools Week. Catholic Schools Week began in 1974 and so did our tradition of celebrating grandparents during this special week. The idea of a National Grandparents Day in the United States first came about in the late 1960s. The official proclamation for a National Grandparents Day, the first Sunday after Labor Day, was made in the late 1970s. This year we will celebrate our grandparents during our Spirit Week on Monday, September 12.

Grandparents and special friends are invited to join us for a special prayer service at 9:00 in the gym. After the service, students will be able to show their grandparents around the building, take a special picture and enjoy a few lite refreshments.

We always welcome grandparents or special friends. We know not all grandparents can attend. If your child has a special friend, he or she is more than welcome. If you are new to the area and your family does not have a grandparent or special friend, a parent may attend. We ask that if a grandparent or friend is attending, parents do not attend. We have limited space and limited parking.

Once our parking lot is full, over flow parking will be available at New Hope Baptist Church on Church Road. There is a shuttle. Please ask grandparents to use the shuttle and not walk across Church Road. The intersection of Church Road and Tchulahoma Road is extremely busy.

Often, grandparents want to check their grandchildren out to spend the day with them. We will not count this as any type of absence. We need all families to complete the bottom of this form and return it to school as soon as possible. You may email it to your child's teacher or send in the hard copy to the teacher. While it may seem repetitive to complete the form multiple times, we need a form for each child for organizational purposes.

To keep the school from having an awkward situation, please work out with your family whether or not your child will be checked out. Please note on the form who will be checking your child out.
